Get Ready to Paint

Supply List

Local art supply stores:

San Rafael downtown Riley Art Supply and Aaron Bros; San Anselmo - Perry's; Terra Linda-Michael's or Ben Franklin, Mill Valley- Art & Paper, Michael's Arts & Crafts.

On-line: Art Supply Warehouse, Cheap Joe's, Blick's Art Supplies and Jerry's Artarama.

Acrylic Paints: Note – student grade is OK but better grade has more color/pigment and less filler. Titanium WhiteCadmium Yellow MedCadmium Red MedAlizarin CrimsonUltramarine Blueoptional: Mars Black, Cad. Yellow light/lemon
Brushes One #8 or #10 size 'Brite' (square-top) – firm not sable or soft. Brush should be labeled for acrylic paintor for acrylic and oil paint. Bring any other sizes you may have.
Palette Tray/board: i.e. a surface to mix paints on. Larger is better. Something with sides e.g. "Butcher Tray" sold at art stores & on-line, ask the clerk. To see a "butcher tray": http://www.dickblick.com/products/butcher-tray-palettes/ or A plastic tray with sides – something with a good open area to mix paint Avoid the plastic trays with small spaces for paint (watercolor palettes), wood or paper.
Supports: i.e. what you paint on FOUR inexpensive canvas panel boards: three 9 x 12; one 11x14. See example on the right here. They look a little like this. Don't have to be Fredric – any brand is fine. This is a view of the back. The brand is not important.
Plus: a container for water (eg. large plastic yogurt container or big fat jar) spray water bottle (you will be 'misting' your paints) rags to wipe brushes (old cut towels are good) or thick paper towels (blue – at Orchard or auto store) paper & pen for taking notes
Optional Apron/bib/old shirt
